FAQs about the National Junior Honor Society

Members must demonstrate continuing leadership, citizenship and character, and must participate in NJHS sponsored activities.

What do members get in return? Members are honored for being outstanding students, and are offered participation in leadership training. Members grow as human beings by participating in various school and individual service projects.

How do selected students become members? Students must return information forms by the specified date and be selected by the St. Regis NJHS Faculty Council. St. Regis will host a formal ceremony in which students will be inducted as official members of the National Junior Honor Society.
